COURSE DESCRIPTION

Designed to present the core elements of a comprehensive, systematic, and multi-component crisis intervention curriculum, the Group Crisis Intervention course will prepare participants to understand a wide range of crisis intervention services. Fundamentals of Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) will be outlined, and participants will leave with the knowledge and tools to provide several group crisis interventions, specifically demobilizations, defusings and the Critical Incident Stress Debriefing (CISD). The need for appropriate follow-up services and referrals when necessary, will also be discussed.

TARGET AUDIENCE

This accredited continuing education activity is designed for nurses, first responders (ie. EMS, Fire, law enforcement, dispatch, corrections, EMA) psychologists, and other health care professionals involved in emergent management.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this activity, the participants should be better able to:

- Discuss key concepts of crisis and stress including essential interventions to help manage psychological and behavioral reactions.
- Describe how Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) strategies can be incorporated into practice including the elements of debriefing and defusing as derived from case examples during role play
- Discuss how the team shares accountability with other professions to meet standards of practice for population focused problem-solving during difficult situations surrounding traumatic events for more cohesive and effective outcomes.
